# SUMMARY WORKFORCE AND PUBLIC ASSISTANCE OUTCOMES OF MISSISSIPPI PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL, COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AND PUBLIC UNIVERSITY GRADUATES

#### **OVERVIEW**

This research brief provides summary information on the employment, earnings and public assistance of graduates from publicK-12 schools, community colleges, and public universities in Mississippi. Data for public assistance among the general population are also presented.

This information was requested by AccelerateMS, to support reporting associated with House Bill 1388, passed in 2022.

#### **DATA**

Data for this study come from Mississippi's SLDS. Data from the following SLDS data stakeholders are included:

- Mississippi Department of Education (MDE)
- Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL)
- Mississippi Community Colleges
- Mississippi Department of Human Services (MDHS)

Additionally, this study required public data from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey.

### **REQUEST**

Accelerate MS has requested the following information for the 2017-2021 time period:

- Average annual earnings of employed Bachelor's Degree graduates from Mississippi public universities within 1 year of graduation.
- Average annual earnings of employed Mississippi public high school graduates within 1 year of graduation.
- Number and percent of Mississippi public high school graduates who received Public Assistance through SNAP / TANF / UI within 1 year of graduation.
- Number and percent of Mississippi public university graduates who received Public Assistance through SNAP / TANF / UI within 1 year of graduation.
- Number and percent of Mississippi community college (all, not just CTE) graduates who received Public Assistance through SNAP / TANF / UI within 1 year of

graduation.

 Number and percent of the "general population" in Mississippi who received Public Assistance through SNAP / TANF / UI from July to June of each year (2017-2021).

The following metrics were generated for students graduating from public K-12 schools, community colleges, and public universities for each year of the study window (Academic Years 2017-2021):

- 1. Number of public K-12, community college, and public university graduates.
- 2. Number of public K-12, community college, and public university graduates not enrolled in any Mississippi postsecondary education within 1 year of graduation.
- 3. Among the public K-12, community college, and public university graduates not enrolled in any Mississippi postsecondary education within 1 year of graduation:
  - a. The number and percent of these graduates who are employed within 1 year of graduation.
  - b. The median annualized earnings of these graduates.
  - c. The number and percent who receive SNAP within 1 year of graduation.
  - d. The number and percent who receive TANF within 1 year of graduation.
  - e. The number and percent who receive UI within 1 year of graduation.
  - f. The unduplicated (unique) number and percent who receive either SNAP, TANF, or UI within 1 year of graduation.

Additionally, the following metrics were generated for the Mississippi population, as well as the Mississippi adult population (age 18-64). Receipt of public assistance is measured from July to June for each year of the study window (2017-2021), so as to more closely align with the measurement period of the other metrics in this report:

- 4. Mississippi population.
- 5. Number and percent of Mississippians who receive SNAP.
- 6. Number and percent of Mississippians who receive TANF.
- 7. Number and percent of Mississippians who receive UI.
- 8. Unduplicated (unique) number and percent of Mississippians who receive either SNAP, TANF, or UI.

In accordance with SLDS Rules and Regulations, numeric values less than 10 are suppressed along with the accompanying percentages. These suppressed values are replaced with the "<10" symbol, and the accompany percent is replaced with the "--" symbol. Additionally, information calculated using MDE data is suppressed if the percentage is either less than 5% or greater than 95%. Suppressed values are replaced with the "<5.00" and ">95.00" symbols, respectively, and the accompanying numeric values are replaced with the "--" symbol.
