Healthcare-Related Postsecondary Outcomes, and Public Assistance Receipt in the Delta Region

OVERVIEW

This research brief, requested by the Delta Council, provides information on the postsecondary enrollment, graduation, and employment of Delta residents that enroll in healthcare related majors at Mississippi community colleges and public universities.

Information is also provided on the number of Delta residents receiving public assistance through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance (SNAP) or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) programs, and the number receiving unemployment insurance (UI) assistance.

For this brief, the Mississippi Delta region includes the following 16 Mississippi counties: Attala, Bolivar, Carroll, Coahoma, Grenada, Holmes, Humphreys, Issaquena, Leflore, Montgomery, Sharkey, Sunflower, Quitman, Tallahatchie, Washington, Yalobusha.

DATA AND INDICATORS

DATA

The data in this brief were made available by the continued funding of Mississippi's State Longitudinal Data System (SLDS) through the state legislature. Data from the following sources were used:

Mississippi Community College Data – Data pertaining to community college enrollment and graduation come from the administrative records of Mississippi's 15 community colleges and the Mississippi Community College Board (MCCB). These data include information on the enrollment, county of residence, academic major, and graduation of approximately 73,000 students each year.

Mississippi Public University Data — Data pertaining to 4-year public university enrollment and graduation come from the administrative records of Mississippi's eight public universities and the Institutions for Higher Learning (IHL). These data include information on the enrollment, county of residence, academic major, and graduation of approximately 81,000 students each year.

Mississippi Employment and Wage Records – Data on employment status and county of employment come from the Mississippi Department of Employment Security (MDES). These data were collected from Mississippi employers that participate in the state's Covered Employment system. Data fields include information on quarterly earnings, company of employment, employer location, and the employer's industry classification code.

Mississippi Unemployment Insurance Data – Data on unemployment insurance (UI) receipt come from the administrative records of the MDES UI program. Data fields include information on length of receipt, county of residence and employment history.

Mississippi Public Assistance Data — Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefit records come from the Mississippi Department of Human Services (MDHS). These data provide information on the benefits received by individuals, county of residence, and the period when benefits were received.

INDICATORS

Using these data, the following indicators were measured:

Postsecondary Enrollment – The number of students from the Mississippi Delta region who enrolled in a healthcare-related program at a Mississippi community college or Mississippi public university from AY 2018-AY 2022.

Total Graduates – The number of students from the Delta region who graduated from a Mississippi community college or Mississippi public university with a healthcare-related degree from AY 2018-AY 2022.

Graduates not Re-enrolled — The number of graduates (from AY 2018-AY 2022) who did not continue pursuing additional postsecondary education at one of Mississippi's public community colleges or universities within a year of graduating from a healthcare-related degree program. These graduates are utilized as the foundation for this report's workforce measurements, because including re-enrolled full-time or part-time students would skew the measurement of a cohort's overall employment and earnings.

Employed Graduates –The number and percent of graduates who did not re-enroll and who are employed within one year of graduation by a Mississippi employer that participates in the state's Covered Employment system.

Public Assistance — The annual number of individuals residing in the Mississippi Delta region who received public assistance through the SNAP or TANF programs, or received UI, from Calendar Year (CY) 2019 to CY 2023.

In accordance with SLDS Rules and Regulations, numeric values less than 10 were suppressed along with the accompanying percentages. These suppressed values were replaced with the "<10" symbol, and the accompany percent was replaced with the "---" symbol.

RESULTS

The following tables provide the results of the analysis.

- Table 1 provides the annual number of Delta residents (from AY 2018-AY 2022) who
 enrolled in a healthcare-related program at a Mississippi community college or public
 university. Results are provided for each included year in total and disaggregated by
 community college and public university enrollment.
- Table 2 provides the annual number of Delta residents (from AY 2018-AY 2022) who graduated with a healthcare related degree from a Mississippi community college or public university. Results are provided for each included year in total and disaggregated by community college and public university graduates.
- Table 3 provides the annual number and percent of Delta residents (from AY 2018-AY 2022) who graduated from a Mississippi community college or public university and found employment (1) within the Delta region or (2) in other regions of Mississippi within a year of graduating. Results are provided in total and disaggregated by community college and public university graduates.
- Table 4 provides the total (five-year summary) number of Delta residents who enrolled and graduated from a Mississippi community college from AY 2018-AY 2022, disaggregated by detailed degree program.
- Table 5 provides the total (five-year summary) number and percent of Delta residents who graduated from a Mississippi community college from AY 2018-AY 2022 and found employment (1) within the Delta region, or (2) within other regions of Mississippi, disaggregated by detailed degree program.
- Table 6 provides the total (five-year summary) number of Delta residents who enrolled and graduated from a Mississippi public university from AY 2018-AY 2022, disaggregated by detailed degree program.
- Table 7 provides the total (five-year summary) number and percent of Delta residents who graduated from a Mississippi public university from AY 2018-AY 2022 and found employment (1) within the Delta region, or (2) within other regions of Mississippi, disaggregated by detailed degree program.
- Table 8 provides the annual number of Delta residents that received public assistance through the SNAP and TANF programs, or received UI, at any point in calendar years 2019-2023.
