Enrollment and Graduation Trends at Mississippi's Public Postsecondary Schools Academic Years 2013 through 2022

August 2023

OVERVIEW

This brief provides information pertaining to enrollment and graduation trends at Mississippi community colleges and Mississippi public universities.

These trends are measured over a 10-year period, from Academic Year (AY) 2013 through AY 2022. Summary information is presented in total, as well as by the student's residency status.

This brief was commissioned by Mississippi State Representative Donnie Bell.

SUMMARY OF KEY FINDINGS

MISSISSIPPI COMMUNITY COLLEGES:

Finding 1 – The overall annual enrollment has fallen (-29%) from AY 2013 to AY 2022, from 98,419 to 69,639.

- Enrollment for in-state students (-30%) fell more sharply than enrollment for out-of-state students (-11%).

Finding 2 – The total number of community college graduates increased by 12% from AY2013 to AY 2022, rising from 13,824 to 15,499.

- The number of in-state graduates increased by 1,309 (+10%), while out-of-state graduates rose by 366 (+73%).

MISSISSIPPI PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES:

Finding 1 – The overall annual enrollment has fallen (-10%) from AY 2013 to AY2022, from 73,134 to 66,107.

- This decrease is the net result of declining in-state student enrollment (-22%) and increasing out-of-state student enrollment (+34%).

Finding 2 – The number of public university graduates has risen by 21% from AY 2013 to AY 2022, increasing from 11,636 to 14,049.

- In-state graduates rose by 255 (+3%) and out-of-state graduates rose by 2,158 (+120%).

METHODOLOGY

DATA SOURCES

The following data were used to measure enrollment and graduation trends; these data were obtained from Mississippi's State Longitudinal Data System (SLDS).

Mississippi Community College Data – Data on community college graduates are contributed to the SLDS by Mississippi's 15 community colleges and the Mississippi Community College Board (MCCB). These data include information on the enrollment, county of residence, and graduation of approximately 73,000 students each year.

Mississippi Public University Data – Data on 4-year public university graduates are contributed to the SLDS by Mississippi's eight public universities and the Institutions for Higher Learning (IHL). These data include information on the enrollment, county of residence, and graduation of approximately 81,000 students each year.

INDICATORS

Using these data, the following indicators were measured:

Mississippi Community College Enrollment – The annual number of students enrolled in a university parallel program or a career technical education program through a Mississippi public community college (including associate degrees and certificates). Students are included if they enroll at any point during the given academic year. Students in dual-enrollment programs and students who explicitly enroll as “non-degree seeking” are excluded from this count. Similarly, students in a non-academic workforce training program (e.g., a workplace safety course) are excluded from this count. Students enrolled in more than one community college or more than one program during the same year are counted once.

Mississippi Community College Graduates – The annual number of students graduating from Mississippi public community colleges with either a certificate or an associate degree in the given academic year. Students earning multiple awards in the same year are counted once.

Mississippi Public University Enrollment – The annual number of students enrolled in an undergraduate program at a Mississippi public university. Students are included if they enroll at any point during the given academic year. Undergraduate programs include certificates, associate degrees, and bachelor's degrees. Students enrolled in more than one university, or more than one program are counted once.

Mississippi Public University Graduates – The annual number of students graduating from a Mississippi public university undergraduate program in the given academic year. Undergraduate programs include certificates, associate degrees, and bachelor's degrees. Students earning multiple awards in the same year are counted once.
